Dual Credit Policy

Albuquerque School of Excellence will provide dual credit program for the students in high school especially in their junior and senior year that has completed many of the credits required by the state. These last two years are a perfect period to sign up for AP classes and dual credit program. Students are encouraged to take at least 15 hours of college credit.

Students will be able to take dual credit courses at local community colleges or 4-year colleges. The class load of a high school student will not exceed two dual credit courses per semester (fall, spring, and summer). However, under special circumstances that indicate a student with exceptional academic abilities is capable of additional college-level work, the academic dean may grant exceptions to this requirement. There is no limit on the hours of college credits a student will earn. Some students may earn up to 36 hours of college credit with a combination of AP, dual credit, and tech prep courses.

Each year that ASE builds up a grade level, number of AP courses will increase. When ASE operates 9-12 high school students will have an option to take -at least- a wide array of 13 AP courses. Starting from their junior year, ASE students will have a change to take at least two dual credit courses per semester. The Dual credits may include but not limited to these Calculus, US History, and Communications etc.
